FEES | GST SPONSORSHIP | PRIZE MONEY CONDITIONS

GST

The TPA & IA is required to pay GST on all entry fees received. **All** entry fees stated in the schedules **include GST**.

All exhibitors must pay the GST inclusive entry fees whether they are registered for GST purposes or not registered.

Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes may be able to claim a credit for GST paid. We recommend you check with your Financial Advisor or the Australian Taxation Office. To assist with any claim for credit we will forward at the exhibitor's request a **Tax Invoice/Receipt** for the total entry fees received including GST.

Primary & Secondary school aged children are exempt from paying entry & admin fees into both Student classes; Primary & Secondary. However, if a primary or secondary student wishes to enter into a class not previously mentioned, they are permitted to pay entry & admin fees as a normal exhibitor.

SPONSORSHIP

The Association is required to pay GST on sponsorship monies received. Sponsorship monies stated in the front of the schedule includes GST paid. Sponsors who are registered for GST purposes may be able to claim a credit for GST paid. We recommend sponsors check with their Financial Advisor or the Australian Taxation Office. PRINT SIZING

Maximum Size 41cm x 30.5cm (16" x 12") & for square images 30cm x 30cm

Minimum Size 25cm x 20cm (10" x 8") & for square images 20cm x 20cm

This means that images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41x30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

STUDENT CATEGORY SIZING

Maximum Size 20 x 25cm (8" x 10") & for square images 20cm x 20cm

Minimum Size 13cm x 18cm (5" x 7") & for square images 13cm x 13cm

This means that images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 20 x 25cm and 13 x 13cm

PRESENTATION

Flush mounted onto board. This means photographs are stuck down to mounting board or preferably foam core-board the same size as the photograph.

Please apply Velcro hooks to the back of each of your artworks, placing them one in each corner.

LABELLING

As per 'Conditions of Entry' in point 7 example. Labelled on back/reverse side of the entry. (Name, Contact Number, Class, Section, Title, Signature). Don't forget to include signed permission for the display of the photograph/s if it's awarded a champion title.

**** All prints not in the above-mentioned format will be disqualified****

PACKAGING

It is important that you please wrap each of your individual photographs in tissue or paper to avoid having your works accidentally damaged.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The exhibits in the Photography section will be displayed for the duration of the show. It is important that all photos are well secured to their backing material as the dry air in the halls can cause the photos to come unattached and fall to the floor.

17. Each class will be awarded a first, second and third prize. The prize money will be identical for all sections being First \$70.00, Second \$50.00 & third \$30.00 with an encouragement award, Highly Commended. An overall Grand Champion will also be awarded with \$200.00 cash.

PHOTOGRAPHY CLASSES

SUBMISSION: All classes can accept both colour, Monochrome & or black & white entries.

With the exception of the Colour Open, (Colour Only) and the Monochrome open Classes (monochrome only)

CAMERAS: Camera of your choice Includes film, digital, phone and drone.

Class 1. Portrait & Environmental Portrait

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41X30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

Capturing images of individuals or groups, with the primary emphasis on showcasing their personality, character, expression and / or their life. Please ensure that the person/ people are the focus of your work and not just part of the wider scape.

Portrait Please be aware that in a portrait the subject's eyes are generally a key focal point, and I would consider blurring the background to place even greater emphasis on their facial features.

Environmental portrait is a portrait that includes more than just the subject. The idea is to capture an individual within a broader context, offering a glimpse into their life, personality, or occupation.

If requested, we may require a model release form, for this class – it is wise to have the subject or subject's guardians' permission before entering your images into competition.

If the image was taken in a public place and is a candid capture this release form is not a requirement.

Class 2. Animals

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41X30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

Capturing animals domestic, family pets, working and or wild animals in their natural habitats or controlled environments. However, no evidence of the cages or fences are allowed. Photographs, that tell a story and or illustrate the importance of animals in our lives, will do well in this theme.

Remember - It is essential to prioritize the welfare of living creatures when capturing wildlife images. Observing this fundamental rule of photography is more important than obtaining any photograph.

Class 3. Macro/Close-Up

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41X30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

Capturing the intricate details of a subject, using but not limited to the use of your lens macro feature, or cameras close-up attachments. These photographs should make the close-up subject larger than life. This category can include zooming into a photograph on a computer to create the photographic close-up effect, for those not wishing to use a macro or lens accessory.

Class 4. Urban

Inclusive of: Streetscape & Architecture

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41X30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

Streetscapes may include city streets, alleys, squares, and public spaces. It may focus our attention on the rhythm of daily life, the interactions between people and their surroundings, old and new buildings, urban decay, city life, transportation, and social issues.

Architecture may include but not limited to showcasing the external or internal character of buildings and structures, whether they are historic landmarks, modern office buildings or residential homes. You may wish to pay attention to details such as lines, shapes, textures, patterns, and the play of light and shadow.

Class 5. Open Colour

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41X30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

Any subject which is treated pictorially, embodying the elements of design, arrangement or composition, and which reflects the personal interpretation of the photographer, this may also be a subject already listed as a Class and may include traditional, artistic and creative photography.

Class 6. Still Life

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41X30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

Still life can include but not limited to capturing images of items arranged in a composed and aesthetically pleasing manner, like fruits, flowers, food, or everyday objects in various settings, they must be visually compelling and thought-provoking images. This category can include creative effects, flat lay photography, food & or commercial photography if you feel it fits within the still life genre.

Class 7. Landscapes, Nightscapes & Seascapes

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41X30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

Landscapes may include but not limited to mountains, forests, plains, deserts, and any other outdoor scenery of the natural environment captured at any time of day or night.

Seascape photography may include but not limited to capturing the beauty, mood, and the essence of a coastal and marine landscapes, the sea, coastline, beaches, cliffs, rocks etc.

People should not be the main point of focus or interest within the works, if present at all.

Nightscapes - involves capturing a landscape style image, at night. This may include the beautiful Milky Way and or a starry sky. Photographers use long exposure, to reveal the beautiful light of a seemingly 'dark' sky to enhance their scapes.

Class 8. Photography as a Creative Art & including Abstract works

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41X30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

Creativity we would like the photographer to think differently about the subject and express themselves in a more artistic way by pushing boundaries.

Abstract - perspective, movement, colour, form, texture and light to transform the world we see into an unexpected and often unrecognizable image with the use of photographic equipment, post-processing or the addition of non-photographic elements added to the works.

This may include

- Advance post processing techniques – digital manipulation
- Intentional camera or subject movement
- Multiple exposures, within post-processing and or camera
- Combining many images into one composite image, all captures used in the process must be the photographer's (entrants) own work.

- Hand colouring or the addition of paint, fabric and or similar materials, However the works must not extend outside the allowed sizes.

There is no right or wrong, images maybe coloured or black and white or a combination.

However, it DOES NOT include the use of AI programs or programs that take visual and / or written prompts to create all or part of the final artwork)

Class 9. Open - Monochrome & Black and White

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41X30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

Important - All black and white images are monochrome images, but not all monochrome images are black and white.

A B&W image may be toned with one colour in post processing (eg sepia) in this theme to give you a Monochrome image.

You can present any subject which is treated pictorially, embodying the elements of design, arrangement or composition, and which reflects the personal interpretation of the photographer, this may also be a subject already listed as a Class and may include traditional, artistic and creative photography.

Class 10. Cultural

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 41X30.5cm and 20 x 20cm.

May include but not be limited to documenting cultural practices, traditions, rituals, customs, lifestyles, of your own or other cultures. This category aims to provide a visual record of the richness, and the worldwide diversity of human life, highlighting the shared values, beliefs, and experiences that shape and define us all, storytelling captures will do well here.

Class 11. Primary Student (Prep – Grade 6)

Open Colour or black & White:

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 20 x 25cm and 13 x 13cm

You can present any subject you like, your favourite image in any style and the only rule is that you must have taken the photograph, and it can be commercially processed by a camera shop, or you may have processed the image yourself.

Class 12. Secondary Student (Grades 7 – 12)

Open Colour or Black & White:

Images can be presented in any size and format (portrait or landscape) between 20 x 25cm and 13 x 13cm

You can present any subject you like, your favourite image in any style and the only rule is that you must have taken the photograph, and it can be commercially processed by a camera shop, or you may have processed the image yourself.
