The Arts & Crafts Section is organised and run by volunteers for the benefit of all entrants and the general public. The number of volunteers and committee members has dropped to a critical low. Without further assistance, it will be extremely difficult to continue to provide this opportunity. A 'Volunteer Nomination Form' is on page 29. Please consider offering some of your time.

Prize Money:

Entry Fees:

The T.P.A. & I. Association is required to pay GST on all entry fees received. All entry fees stated in the schedule include GST. All Entrants must pay the GST inclusive entry fees whether they are registered or not for GST purposes. Entrants who are registered for GST purposes may be able to claim a credit for GST paid. We recommend you check with your financial adviser or the Australia Taxation Office. To assist with any claim for credit, a tax Invoice/Receipt will be available from the Show Office for the total entry fees received including the GST.

Collection of Entries and Prizes:

Collection Day is Tuesday 8th July, 3:30pm – 5:30pm. Entries and Prizes not collected on this day will be available from the Administration Office, T.P.A. & I. (Show Office) from Monday 14th to Friday 25th July inclusive. Please Note: Prizes not collected by Friday 25th July will be re banked or sent back to sponsors. Administration Office, T.P.A. & I. (Show Office) will not be held responsible for uncollected entries after Tuesday 8th July 2025.

Sponsorship:

The T.P.A. & I. Association is required to pay GST on sponsorship monies received. Sponsorships monies stated in the schedule include GST. Sponsors who are registered for GST purposes may be able to claim a credit for GST paid. We recommend sponsors check with their financial adviser or the Australia Taxation Office. We will issue a Tax Invoice to sponsors if requested.

Prize Money:

Prize money stated in the schedule excludes GST. GST will be added to the prize money for Entrants who are registered for GST purposes and provide our Association with a Tax Invoice.

Information in this schedule is believed to be correct at the time of printing and is subject to change without notice.

The committee of the Society will not be held responsible for any unintended inaccuracies that may occur.

Entry Form:

Please ensure sufficient information is included on your entry form to properly identify your entries and to aid in our displaying of them. For example, please state size of item, colour, and design. ie: King size quilt 8'x10', Red and blue stars and stripes.

Please read the schedule carefully to find the different Sections, Classes and Conditions of Entry. New classes have been added, and classes and conditions have been altered or deleted. Days and dates of nominations and entry intake have changed.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY and IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Nomination Forms and Entry Fees must reach the T.P.A. & I. Association by Friday 9th May 2025, at 4.00pm. LATE NOMINATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- Lodgement of Entries will be accepted under the Main Grandstand at the Arts & Crafts end between 1.00pm and 4.00pm on Saturday 21st June 2025. Please note the change of day to Saturday NOT Sunday. <u>LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.</u>
- 3. <u>A Presentation Ceremony</u> open to all sponsors, entrants and immediate family (gold coin donation to help cover costs) will be held on **Thursday 3rd July 2025**, from **5.30pm to 7pm**, where prizes and prize monies can be collected. Presentation of major prizes will commence at 6.00pm.
- 4. <u>Collection of Entries and prize money</u> will be on Tuesday 8th July 2025 under the Main Grandstand at the Arts & Crafts end between 3.30pm and 5.30pm. Entries will not be available for collection before 3.30pm. Entries and Prizes not collected on this day will be available from the Administration Office, T.P.A. & I. (Show Office) from Monday 14th to Friday 25th July inclusive. Please Note: Prizes not collected by Friday 25th July will be re banked or sent back to sponsors. T.P.A. & I. (Show Office) will not be held responsible for uncollected entries after Tuesday 8th July 2025.
- 5. Our Volunteer Stewards make every endeavour to ensure security of items submitted. Neither our Volunteer Stewards nor the T.P.A. & I. will be responsible for the loss or damage to the items whilst the items are in their custody.
- 6. Concerns have been raised regarding the security and displaying of the entries. At no time is the building left unattended and unlocked. We have not had items stolen or lost. Volunteer Stewards are supervising the display during the Show, to ensure items are not touched and the layout has been changed slightly for easier supervision. More volunteers are always welcome. If you have any suggestions on ways we can improve the facilities, please put them in writing to the Chief Steward.
- 7. Up to two (2) entries per person per class are permissible. Entries entered into the wrong class may be transferred to an appropriate class at the discretion of the Chief Steward. Entries cannot be entered into more than one class.
- 8. Classes attracting less than three (3) nominations in the 2025 Show may be deleted from the following year's schedule at the Chief Steward's discretion.
- 9. A Novice class is available in some Sections for Entrants who have not won a prize in that section at a previous Townsville Show and have been learning for three (3) years or less.
- 10. The Stewards' Committee relies on the integrity of all entrants. Entries must be the entrant's own work, completed during the past 12 months. Items completed in a workshop are eligible providing that you have done all the work yourself. Entries must look new, fresh, clean and tidy.
- 11. A register of all work submitted will be kept to prevent any unpleasantness arising from suggestions of repeated entry of the same item in subsequent years. Work judged previously cannot be altered slightly and entered in future shows.
- 12. Entrants wishing to offer their works for sale may do so, with 10% commission being retained by the T.P.A. & I. Association.
- 13. The entrant's name is <u>NOT</u> to be displayed on the entry. <u>ENTRIES WILL BE DISQUALIFIED</u> IF A NAME IS VISIBLE TO JUDGES.
- 14. Class tags will be posted to Entrants. Class tags are to be attached securely; preferably to the lower front right hand corner of the entry. Safety pins are recommended, NO sticky tape, except for entries where pins cannot be used. Extra class tags are available for 'accessory items'.

- 15. All eligible entries will be judged. Bearing in mind safety concern, all entries will be displayed where space permits. Entry fees will not be refunded if entries are not displayed.
- 16. **Framed entries <u>MUST</u>** be ready to hang. If hanging facilities are not supplied, the item may not be displayed.
- 17. Patchwork quilts require a hanging sleeve and Wall Hangings require a hanging sleeve and a rod except for the UFO (Unfinished Object) class. If hanging facilities are not supplied, item may not be displayed. Rod must be suitable to hold the weight of the wall hanging. Rods must be labelled with a separate class tag (not named). If a temporary hanging pocket needs to be attached, please label (Temporary pocket) for judging purposes. If unable to supply rod, please contact Chief Steward prior to drop off.
- 18. **In Knitting and Crochet**, entries must have a sizeable yarn sample attached to the entry with a small safety pin. If washing is part of the technique of the item, please state so on the label.
- 19. **In Hand Coloured Fabrics**, a sample of original fabric before colouring <u>must be</u> attached, otherwise the item may be disqualified.
- 20. For scrapbooking classes, pages <u>must be</u> in sleeve protectors.
- 21. To add interest for the viewing public and for judging information, you may include a typed or printed statement to highlight extra techniques used e.g. any special features, hours taken, the number of pieces used, the story relating to entry.
- 22. With Age Related sections, the age limit is determined as at 31st May 2025. In children's Sections P & S, **age and school year level to be advised on entry form**. Children may enter a separate entry in the open sections, **however age and school level <u>must not</u> be displayed on the entry if entered in an Open section**
- 23. **A Special Needs Person** is anyone possessing a disability that creates a greater challenge to the making of his/her article. This may include a physical, visual, or intellectual disability. To aid judging, please indicate your special need on the Entry Form.
- 24. The Aggregate Champion of Sewing and Crafts Award is for all local Entrants only, in the open sections 1A to 1K inclusive and innovative class. To win, an entrant must gain the highest score above 20 points. Aggregate points will be: First 3pts, Second 2pts, Third 1pt, with all points won to be counted towards the "Aggregate Champion of Sewing and Crafts Award." Local Entrants are persons residing in the area south to Home Hill, west to Charters Towers, north to Ingham / Palm Island Group and Magnetic Island. As the Novice and over 70 years classes are not open to all entrants these classes are not eligible in the Aggregate Champion Award.
- 25. **The Supreme Exhibit of the Arts and Crafts** is judged from the Section Champion Pieces from all adult sections, across 1A to 1L inclusive.
- 26. **The Section Champions** are judged from the first prizes in the classes of that section. No Champion will be awarded if there are not entries in at least 3 classes of that Section, except for an outstanding piece of work. In Sections 1E, and Junior Sections 1P, 1S, one entry cannot win both champion prizes.
- 27. The judge's decision is final and no correspondence or discussions will be entered into.

 Prizes will not be awarded if entries are of insufficient merit.
- 28. No free passes to the 2025 Townsville show are available to Entrants.
- 29. Entries can only be collected by the Entrant unless permission has been provided in writing authorising another person to collect items.

TIPS & TRICKS

Please remember this is a community show, and we encourage everybody to enter. Do not be afraid, all entries are displayed and we love to see the huge range of crafts that come through our hall each year. We have a class for you including Novice for first timers. The feedback we receive each year highlights how inspired people are by the talents we have available to us here in our own community. We always need more volunteers to help run the Arts and Crafts and would love to hear from you if you can spare some time, details are on the back of your entry form. Come one, come all...

Read/Check the Conditions of Entry and Important Information pages:

Dates: Check and make note of the closing dates for nominations and the drop off day for your items – late entries/nominations will not be accepted.

Up to 2 entries per person per class

Your name is not to be visible on the item, this will result in disqualification. Pink tags received via mail need to be attached with a safety pin (tape appropriate for framed item) **PRIOR TO ARRIVAL AT THE HALL**.

Remember, your item will be on display, if it has a story or any special techniques, please attach these details to your item on drop off day.

Hanging items need to have appropriate hooks/poles to enable them to be displayed. Please note only wall hangings need to supply rods, however quilts will need to have a rod pocket to enable displaying. Any accessories need to be labelled as an accessory to the item it is displaying (no name).


