Due to insurance and liability waivers, competitor names may not be substituted in classes. Every competitor must acknowledge the waiver to be eligible to compete.

ENTRIES:

The Chief Steward, may at their discretion, amalgamate classes that do not attract sufficient entries.

PRIZES & PRIZE MONEY:

You must nominate a bank account when doing entries. Prize money will be paid by direct deposit from the Townsville show office between Monday 14th July 2025 and Friday 26th July 2025

STABLING

A stabling list will be posted onto the Show Office Window as well as to the Board at the Stewards Office on Friday 4th July 2025. This will also be made available on Facebook. All efforts will be made to allocate preferred stabling; however, allocation will be based on availability.

Cost: \$15 per stable

\$5per cattle yard / mini stable

CAMPING

Can be booked through nominate. Spaces on the ground are limited and first preference will go to travelling competitors. 4 day maximum, costs inclusive of 4 days regardless of length of actual stay.

Cost: \$60 Inside grounds

\$50 Outside grounds

Refund Policy - must provide a vet or medical certificate within 24 hours of the closing of the competition.

ENTRY FEES:

- The TPA&IA are required to pay GST on all entry fees received. <u>ALL</u> entry fees stated in the schedules include GST.
- <u>ALL</u> exhibitors must pay the GST inclusive entry fees whether they are registered for GST purposes or not registered.
- Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes may be able to claim a credit for GST paid. We recommend you check with your Financial Advisor or the Australian Taxation Office. To assist with any

claim for credit we will forward all exhibitors a Tax Invoice/Receipt for the total entry fees received including GST

SPONSORSHIP:

- The Association is required to pay GST on sponsorship monies received.
- Sponsorship monies stated in the front of the schedule includes GST paid.
- Sponsors who are registered for GST purposes may be able to claim a credit for GST paid. We recommend Sponsors check with their Financial Advisor or the Australian Taxation Office. We will issue a Tax Invoice to all sponsors.

PRIZE MONEY & RIBBONS

- Ribbons to 5th place
- All classes 1st \$25, 2nd \$15 & 3rd \$7 unless otherwise stated

*Prize money stated in the schedule excludes GST. GST will be added to the prize money for exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes and provide our Association with a Recipient Created Tax Invoice. Townsville Pastoral Agricultural & Industrial Association will not issue tax invoices in respect of prizes. Some prizes may be in the form of vouchers or prizes from Sponsors. (cash will not be given out instead of prizes.) Please inform the Townsville Pastoral Agricultural & Industrial Association that you are registered when nominating and notify TPA & IA again, if you cease to be registered.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Exercising horses Horses will be restricted to the designated areas. Please follow all directions
- 2. No horses to be permitted to start unless nomination fee is paid in full. THIS WILL BE ENFORCED.
- 3. Name of horse must be stated at the time of entry or nominations will not be accepted.
- 4. Age of all horses to be computed as from 1st August. Every horse foaled before 1st August in any year shall be deemed to be one year old on that date.
- 5. All specified Breed Class horses entered for competition must be registered in a Stud Book of the breed recognized by the Royal National Association. Registration papers to be shown on request of Stewards.

DEFINITIONS

** Please note that if you compete in the Show Hunter Hack Section you will not be eligible to compete in the Ridden Hack Section. You will have to make the decision as to whether you think your horse is a hunter hack or show hack.

- 7. NOVICE Hack means any horse that has not won an open Championship at any Agricultural Show.
- 8. NEWCOMER horse will be eligible by Equestrian Australia Newcomer rules
- 9. LOCAL means Townsville area only, and is defined as a person who has been a resident of that area for a period of six months preceding the Show.
- 10. CHILDS HACK must be ridden by a child 17 and under, to be judged on suitability as a child's hack
- 10. All local events to be competed by a local rider and horse combination only. Travelling horses from outside the defined area cannot compete in local events.
- 11. Youngstock is defined as under 2 years old as at 1 August 2025.
- 12. Open Novice Sport horse is for horses who have not competed in horse sports before
- 13 <u>OTT series</u> Thoroughbred's showing hack qualities. This class is for stud book registered Thoroughbred horses who have either raced or trialled. Must be entered under their racing name. This class will include a ridden work out and a led work out. Please have a strapper available for untacking and re-tacking

RING REGULATIONS

- 12. No parent/carer to enter the ring with child competitors except in Special Class Pairs and Rider Classes 6 years and under or specified Led/lead line classes.
- 13. All competitors are requested to enter the assembly yard when called. No competitor will be allowed to enter a class after the third and final call. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.
- 14. Competitors must make arrangements to have gear ready for all events. No waiting for gear will be Allowed.
- 15. No person UNDER 18 YEARS is permitted to lead or ride a stallion of any breed in any class, except where otherwise stated.
- 16. All colts, and stallions to be led by an adult and must be completely under the control of the handler.
- 17. No stallion may enter in Hack or Riding Classes, except where specifically stated. All entire horses (stallions) are permitted to use as an alternative to a bar or bit, a properly fitted stallion chain used either across the nose or under the jaw of the exhibit. Such chain to be made of 1mm welded links and to be attached to a strongly constructed halter and lead.
- 18. No substitution of a person or animal will be allowed without the permission of the Horse Committee.

 Any person or animal entered without permission will be disqualified.

JUDGING

- 19. CHAMPION & RESERVE CHAMPION SASHES WILL BE AWARDED AT THE DISCRETION OF JUDGES. Youngstock class winners are ELIGIBLE for Grand Champion Male and Female Exhibit. All Youngstock winners are eligible to compete in the CHAMPION YOUNGSTOCK class.
- 20. Hack, Galloways and Ponies entered in any class for which a prescribed height is a condition must be measured by the Official Measurer, who will issue a Certificate of Height. The Certificate of Height must be presented to the Stewards before the horse or pony can compete
- 21. When measuring a hack, galloway or pony, allowance of 12mm is to be made for shoes. When an exhibitor disagrees with the Official Measurer's figure for an animal which has been measured with shoes on, (s)he may, should (s)he so desire, request the removal of the shoes.
- 22. All exhibitors and attendants must obey the instruction of the Stable Steward while they or their exhibits are within the precinct of the horse stalls and adjacent yards. If any person fails to carry out the instructions of the Stable Steward, (s)he may order the whole or part of the exhibits of any such person to be removed from the Show grounds and may cancel the whole or part of the nominations of such person
- 23. NO ACCESS PASSES WILL BE ISSUED TO ANY EXHIBITOR WHO'S ENTRANCE FEES AMOUNT TO LESS THAN TWENTY-TWO DOLLARS (\$22.00). PASSES MAY BE COLLECTED ON FRIDAY 4TH July 2025 OR BEFOREHAND FROM 9:00am until 12:00 noon from the Administration Office. Entry Fees not amounting to \$22.00, Access passes are able to be purchased.

ADDITIONAL PASSES - PRE SHOW \$5.00

- 24. Horse exhibitors will be admitted through the Parkes Street gate only.
- 25. VEHICLES ON GROUND Vehicles other than approved camping units are not permitted to park in the Show grounds. One hour is allowed for unloading gear, etc. after which vehicles are required to leave the grounds.

- 26. No horse shall be displayed or exposed for sale on the Show grounds without the permission of the Manager a fee of \$50.00 to be paid to the Administration Office before a 'For Sale' sign can be displayed.
- 27. Protests must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$50, within one (1) hour of the time of conducting the event concerned in the protest.
- 28. If in the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon of the Association, an animal on the Show grounds shall be so injured or to be so affected by sickness, disease or other ailment as to warrant its destruction or its removal from the Show grounds and/or shall be entitled to require the owner to forthwith remove the animal from the Show grounds. All costs incurred by the Association in connection with such animal shall be for the account of the owner and shall be refunded by them to the Association.
- 29. No person under disqualification recognized by this Association might exhibit or compete.
- 30. The committee reserves the right to combine, modify or delete classes where there are insufficient nominations. (Minimum of 3.)
- 31. ANY ANIMALS NOT RESTRAINED OR ACTING IN A MANNER TO CAUSE NUISANCE TO THE PUBLIC OR OTHER CAMPERS WILL BE REMOVED, WITHOUT NOTICE, BY OFFICERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL.

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT

Any exhibitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Show grounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and the general public and is a requirement of the Workplace Health and Safety Act of 1995. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Townsville Show. Exhibitors should check all electrical equipment and leads before coming to the Show grounds to avoid occurrence of any difficulties.

HELMETS

ALL ENTRANTS MUST WEAR Equestrian Helmets, that meet the current Australian Standard (as published in the "Queensland Equestrian Contract")

All helmets will require to be tagged as per EA rules

STABLING

- 32. STABLING: No stabling application will be recognized UNLESS IN WRITING, ACCOMPANIED BY THE APPROPRIATE FEES, PAID IN FULL, THROUGH NOMINATE.
 - Stabling can be booked through nominate.
 - Stables will be available for locals (exhibitors living within a 50 klm radius of Townsville) only after visiting exhibitors have been catered for. Stallions will have preference for stables in all cases. Horses placed in stables without authority will be removed at once from the Show grounds. Any stables not claimed by 5.00 pm on Saturday will be re-allocated for use by other exhibitors.
 - PLEASE NOTE: Stable bedding is limited. If extra bedding is required, it is the exhibitor's responsibility
- 33. STABLING NONLOCALS: All stables to be locked and will be available for day use only
- 34. Stabling steward will be in by appointment: 4th July 2025

If requiring your pre-booked stables outside of these hours, please make prior arrangements on your stable application form or by phoning the Administration Office on 07 4771 4964 between the hours of 8:30am until 4:30pm Monday to Friday ***times subject to change.

- 35. STABLING DAILY: If sufficient stables are available they can be booked for one day only.
- 36. Allocation of stalls and the movement of horses and gear to and from such stall shall be under the control of the Stable Steward. Exhibitors not carrying out the instructions of the Stable Steward may be barred from competing and the animals concerned must be removed from the Show grounds
- 37. STALLION STALLS (H BLOCK): Stallion stalls will be locked.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- 1. The Judge shall have the right to disqualify any exhibit, if in his/her opinion such exhibit is not eligible to compete in the class in which it is entered or paraded and upon such disqualification the exhibit shall forthwith be removed from the Judging Ring.
- 2. All riders and attendants must be neatly and appropriately attired. With Covered shoes. **Shorts, singlets,** thongs and similar attire is not permitted.
- 3. All horses to be approved before the starting of each event. A Judge in any event may warn off a horse that in his/her opinion is unfit to be ridden in such an event.
- 4. The Committee reserves the right to have any horse examined for soundness by the Association's Veterinary Surgeon. Any horse found unsound shall not be permitted to compete.
- 5. The excessive use of whips or spurs by any rider in any contest will not be countenanced. Any rider continuing the practice after being warned may be debarred from competing further in the particular event. No spurs with spikes will be permitted.
- 6. Cruelty to horses is forbidden either in the ring or in the paddock or elsewhere. A competitor found guilty of committing a definite act of cruelty would be disallowed from taking part in all competitions of the event where the offence was committed. This decision rests with the Ring Committee from which there is no further appeal.

DOPING:

It is forbidden to administer any stimulant, or depressant to a horse, or to cause one the administered, in anyway whatsoever, either before the start of the competition or on the previous day, under the maximum penalty of disqualification for life of the owner, rider, horse and groom. If during a competition, or after a test which forms part of a combined effort, it is necessary to treat a horse with a drug that is calming, anti-tetanus, fortifying, stimulating, etc, the Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the organising committee must be informed immediately. He will verify the expediency of the treatment given and then make a report to the Ringmaster, who will decide whether the horse is to be allowed to continue, or is to be eliminated.

All stimulating or fortifying treatments not considered necessary to the accredited Veterinary Surgeon and administered during or after a test, which continues on the following day(s), involves the compulsory elimination of the horse. If the treatment has been for colic only, the committee appointed to examine the condition of the horse (if there is one), decides before the beginning of the next test, whether the horse is in a fit state to continue or should definitely be eliminated. If there is no such committee, the decision rests with the Ground Jury.

The use of hormones, tranquilizers and/or analgesics is prohibited. The Ringmaster will deal with any exhibitor violating this regulation.

The Ringmaster may make or cause to be made any test of any exhibit to determine whether any drug or stimulant has been administered to such an exhibit and may take possession of any such exhibit for any of the afore said purposes and detain such horse for such a period as deemed necessary. Drug means any substance capable of affecting the performance or behaviour of a horse by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the respiratory system, the alimentary system, the muscular-skeletal system or the anti-genital system and shall include analgesics, anti-histamines, anti-inflammatory agents, blood coagulants, diuretics, hormones and their synthetic counterparts, cortico-steroids, anabolic steroids, local anesthetic, muscle relaxants and tranquilizers and vitamins administered by injection. Any exhibit that has been brought to the Show grounds and is found by a Steward to have had administrated to it any drug as defined above might be disqualified from any event or class for which it has competed at the Show.

When any horse which is on the Show grounds for the purpose of taking part in a class or event at the Show is found to have had administered to it, a drug as defined above by the owner or any other person who was in charge of the horse, may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Association.

Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of a horse in any event or class at the Show, any drug as defined above or has in his possession any electric or galvanic apparatus or improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Association.

The Association and any Steward, servant or agent of the Association shall not be liable to an exhibitor for the death of or for injury, damage or infection which may be sustained by his/her exhibit occasioned by or arising out of any act or omission of any Steward, servant or agent of the Association during the course of the testing of the exhibit whether due to the negligence of any such Steward, servant or agent or otherwise.

GENERAL RULING FOR HORSE COMPETITORS

- No mounting in the stabling area is permitted. Mounting is only permitted in the marshalling area. you may take your own mounting block and store safely in the marshaling area. Stable managers will ask any rider mounted to immediately dismount. This is a safety issue and must be abided.
 RIDERS WHO ARE FOUND TO BE MOUNTED OR RIDING IN ANY AREA OTHER THAN THE
 MARSHALLING AREA OR COMPETITION RINGS MAY BE DISQUALIFIED FROM COMPETITION AND WILL
 FORFEIT ALL NOMINATION & STABLING FEES. THIS IS A MAJOR SAFETY ISSUE FOR THE PUBLIC
- 2. Competitors must use the gate marked for 'arena entry only'. This gate is located opposite the Horse Show Secretary's Box and must be used to enter and exit the area. This crossing is used by competitors and the public, therefore competitors must abided by stable manager's instruction for safe crossing to the arena.
- 3. Competitors are not permitted to leave the show grounds outside of the designated times as posted on the entry gate to the stabling block. Horses are to remain in their allocated stable until said times.
- 4. Stables must be cleaned out at the end of each day, with manure placed in allocated spot. IF YOUR
 STABLE IS FOUND TO BE DIRTY, YOU WILL BE SENT AN INVOICE FOR THE CLEANING COSTS
- 5. The public is granted permission to visit the stables. Competitors are encouraged to be welcoming and to practice safety when the public is present.
- 6. The Horse Show Secretary box will be open from 7am each day of the show
- 7. All Competitors must adhere to a Code of Conduct set by Show Management. It is expected that competitors conduct themselves in a professional manner, showing respect and safety at all times for other competitors, show staff and members of the public. An animal welfare policy will also be in place to highlight the importance of safe, humane animal practices.
- 8. Alcohol is not permitted within the horse show domain, including stabling, float parking, marshalling or arena areas.
- 9. Youth are not permitted to be left unattended and must be accompanied in the stables, to the marshalling area and to the arena and back. Stabling staff and chief show stewards will be able to direct parents of a safe place to stand whilst their child is competing.
- 10. Any competitor found to be failing to follow these rules may be disqualified, have any prize money owing deducted, asked to leave the showground, depending upon severity of act.
- 11. DISTRICT is defined as "encompassing Ingham to Charters Towers to Home Hill"
- 12. LOCAL RIDER is defined at living in the Townsville City Council district for a minimum of 6 months
- 13. Signs will be posted stating directions and instructions. These are to be followed at all times.
- 14. Gypsy Cobs may be APSB or Heavy horse or Baroque depending on registration, but must choose only 1 class

TSHS HENDRA VACCINATION POLICY – Horses ARE NOT required to BE Hendra Vaccinated to complete at the Townsville Show 2025. HHD and horse movement forms must be correctly maintained by competitors

NEW/AMENDED RULES

- 1. ** Please note that if you compete in the Show Hunter Hack Section you will not be eligible to compete in the Ridden Hack Section. You will have to make the decision as to whether you think your horse is a hunter hack or show hack
- 2. Pony is defined as not exceeding 14hh, Galloway over 14hh not exceeding 15hh, and hack is over 15hh. All horses must have measuring certificate. Measuring stewards decision is final.
- 3. Small Ponies to be ridden by a child 14 years and under
- 5. Working Hunter:

Headgear to be worn in accordance with EA Regulations and must have the appropriate chin strap.

- * All Classes to be ridden in an English Style Saddle
- * Bridles are to have plain brow bands and no coloured ribbons are to be worn in hair
- * Junior Riders are not permitted to wear top boots. (Junior Rider 17 years & under)
- * Competitors will be asked to gallop either individually or as a group.
- * Competitors will be asked to jump. Fences will be approximately: 500mm for Ponies 600mm for Galloways 700mm for Horses

JUMPING RULES

Maximum of 2 horses per person per class

NATIONAL JUMPING RULES

All classes 1.05m and above will require EQ Queensland competitive membership, life horse registration and a competition licence.

Article 238 – Methods of determining the scores under Table A

- 2. Competitions against the clock
- 2.1 One Round, Against the Clock

Athletes with equality of Penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of Penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule.

2.2 One Round with a Jump Off

This is a Competition against the clock, but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties and time in the first round.

Article 255 - EA Amateur Riders, Juniors, Children and Young Riders

- 1. Amateur Rider classes are classes for Athletes who:
- 1.1 Athletes must meet the membership requirements as set out in the EA General Regulations.
- 1.2 Athletes may compete as amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 21 years of age
- 1.3 Amateur Rider classes are classes for Athletes who:
- Must not have competed in an Olympic Games or World Equestrian Games in either Jumping or Eventing
- In the past 10 years must not have competed in a World Cup for Jumping Riders qualifying competition or in a 5* 3 day event/ 4* 3 day event prior to 2019.
- Must not have competed in section 1 or 2 at a Royal Show in Sydney, Brisbane, Melbourne, Adelaide, or Perth in the past two years

- Amateur Riders may not compete in an Amateur class on a Horse that will compete in any class where the first round is higher than 1.20m at that event.
- 2 **Juniors**: Athletes can take part in Competitions for Juniors until the end of the calendar year, in which they reach the age of 18 years
- 2.1 Athletes may take part in open Competitions 1.20m and above from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 years
- 2.2 Junior Championships at State, National Championships and in Junior Championships with heights of 1.20m above in show schedules a minimum age of 12yrs applies.
- 2.3 A Junior Athlete may compete in Junior and Senior Competitions on the same horse at the same event in National and State Jumping Competitions, and Agricultural Shows UNLESS permission is denied in the Schedule.
- 2.4 In Competitions with the word "Senior" in the title (Example: Senior Championship, Senior Grand Prix, Senior Six Bar), Athletes are eligible to compete from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years
- 2.5 Junior competitions are special classes that do not count for points.
- 3. **Children**: An Athlete may compete in Children's classes until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 14 years old.
- 3.1 Starting height in the first round for Children's classes is a maximum of 1m
- 3.2 Children's Competitions do not count for points
- 4 **Young Riders**: Athletes may take part in Competitions and Championships for Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 21.

 4.1 In all Young Rider classes the course must have a minimum height of 1.30 metres.
- 4.2 A Young Rider Athlete may compete in Young Rider and Senior Competitions on the same horse at the same event in National and State Jumping Competitions, and Agricultural Shows UNLESS permission is denied in the Schedule.

In Competitions with the word "Senior" in the title (Example: Senior Championship, Senior Grand Prix, Senior Six Bar), Athletes are eligible to compete from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years

Article 262 – Power and Skill competitions Six Bar Competition

- 1.15 In this Competition, six vertical obstacles are placed in a straight line about 11 m apart from each other. They must be identically constructed and composed only of poles of the same type. The cups supporting the poles must have a maximum depth of 20mm. The number of obstacles may be reduced depending on the size of the arena.
- 1.16.1 All the obstacles may be kept at the same height, for example 1.20m or 1.16.2 at progressive heights, for example 1.10 m, 1.20 m, 1.30 m, 1.40 m, 1.50 m, 1.60 m, or

In the event of a Refusal or a Run-out, the Athlete must restart the course at the obstacle where the fault was made.

Article 274 Competition in two Phases.

- 2. Special Two-Phase Competition
- 2.1 This Competition comprises two phases run without interruption, each at an identical or different speed, the finishing line for the first phase being identical with the starting line for the second phase.
